

We are in a competition with the SAL. Please bring your jugs of dimes to Mid Winter to keep our President out of the pool and to put their Commander in there!



Nominations are accepted through local ALA units. If you know of someone deserving of one of these awards, please go to the ALA Department of Texas C&Y program page download and fill out a <u>nomination form</u> and send it to your Division's C&Y Committee member

Most Outstanding Unit Children & Youth Program (per division)

Include events, activities, members who volunteered and donations earned. Include pictures, pictures, pictures! You will receive a confirmation when your award is submitted.

Youth Hero Award

- Youth Hero Award winners receive a medal and a certificate.
- They may be a Junior Auxiliary member or someone eligible for membership, but eligibility is not a criterion for consideration
- They should have demonstrated a physical act of valor (Heimlich, CPR, first aid, rescuing from fire or water peril)
- They serve as an inspirational role model for the organization and the community

Good Deed Award

The nominee may be a Junior Auxiliary member or someone eligible for membership, but eligibility is not necessary for consideration.

Possible good deeds include spending time and/ or money for a worthy cause (such as troop support, raising money to help homeless veterans, a food drive, etc.

My memories of working "For God and Country" came from assisting and watching them work proudly as Denbigh Post 368 evolved into the dedicated American Legion Post it is today.







LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE BULLETIN #2

November 2023



<u>Conducting a Unit Meeting:</u> To be successful as a volunteer organization in today's busy world, unit meetings need to be planned to best hone the volunteers' time. Plan your agenda, keeping in mind your unit's bylaws, and publicize it to your members in advance so that they can plan their time accordingly. There is a sample meeting agenda available that shows the order of a variety of activities including officer installation. It is not necessary that every one of the examples be on the agenda at every meeting. Units may find that their members prefer a more abbreviated agenda.

In the Unit Guidebook found on the Texas website, <u>www.alatexas.org</u>, it describes the roles and responsibilities of everyone taking part in the unit meeting.

The President as Presiding Officer calls the meeting to order. If a quorum is present, the president proceeds with necessary business, the presiding officer performs the following functions


- Preserves order throughout the meeting
- Follows the agenda
- Uses the reference "the Chair" instead of "I"
- Follows parliamentary procedures
- While presiding, takes o part in any discussion and refrains from expressing personal opinions; calls upon the vice president to preside if the president wishes to speak on a motion or leave the chair. Remains out of chair until the vote on the pending motion is taken.

An example of the order of Business can be found in the Unit Guidebook. Not every item will be used at every meeting throughout the year. The order should be changed to fit the type of meeting being held.

<u>Dress Code:</u> The Unit meeting is a business meeting, so at the least the appropriate dress would be Business Casual, most especially for the Unit officers. Proper dress brings decorum and respect to our organization and helps to set the tone of the business session.

<u>Requirement for Voting:</u> A unit cannot require that a member attend a certain number of meetings to vote. The right to vote and the right to hold office are clear privileges of membership.

- ➤ Average Fire Fighter's pay in Texas is \$31.25/hr

Awards

Please submit your Poppy Report BEFORE May 1st, 2024. The top 3 reports will receive a prize! All entries will receive a certificate.

Poppy Poster Contest Rules

Units shall sponsor contests in local schools. When schools do not conduct activities, other youth groups — including Junior members — may participate under direct supervision of the unit.

Contest Classes

- Class I: Grades 2 and 3Class II: Grades 4 and 5Class III: Grades 6 and 7
- Class IV: Grades 8 and 9Class V: Grades 10 and 11
- Class VI: Grade 12
- Class VII: Students with special needs defined as:
 - a. Those in special education classes.
 - b. A student recommended for special education classes but who has not been admitted due to a waiting list or various other factors.
 - c. A child identified as having a disability, but not in a special education class due to lack of facilities; identification contingent upon discretion of school officials.

Poppy Poster Requirements

- 1. Each poster shall have a fitting slogan not to exceed 10 words. Articles "a", "and," "an", "the" are not to be counted as words. The words "buddy" and "buy" cannot be used.
- 2. The words "American Legion Auxiliary" must be used in the design of the poster and will not be counted in the 10-word count.
- 3. Each poster must include a red poppy.
- 4. The department shall determine the closing date of the unit contest. The poster shall be on 11x14" poster board. (Drawing paper will not be accepted).
- 5. The United States flag may be used as long as there are no infractions of the flag code.
- 6. Posters will be judged using the following criteria:
 - 50% poster appeal (layout, message, originality)
 - 40% artistic ability (design and color)
 - 10% neatness
- 7. Media used shall be watercolors, crayons, powder or oil paint, handmade paper cutouts, ink or textures, acrylics, pencils, and markers.
- 8. Written in ink on the back of the poster (not attached) shall be the class in which the entry is submitted, the name, address, age, and grade of the contestant and the name of the department.
- 9. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant non-exclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.

- 10. The poster shall be the work of only one individual.
- 11. The label "In Memoriam" from the veteran-made poppy may not be used.

Poppy Poster Contest Judging and Awards

- 1. Each department shall establish its own procedure for judging.
- 2. A citation will be given for the most outstanding poster in each classification within the five divisions.
- 3. Unit members should follow deadlines and process for the department. All department entries are due to the division chairman by June 1.
- 4. While ALA representatives will do their best to return all posters, it is not guaranteed. We recommend participants take a picture or scan their poster for their records.
- 5. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant nonexclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.
