Work with an installation Family Readiness Group (FRG)

Remember even if you aren't near a military installation, there are likely servicemembers and their families in your community; Active-duty military recruiters; National Guard and Reservists. Use Military OneSource's *find-your-installation* link for local information.

Don't forget the <u>military recruiters</u> who live in your community! They are present in communities across the country. Stop by your local recruiting station and introduce yourself and ask about needs they personally have and ask they can convey your desire to assist to local military families.

NATIONAL SECURITY PROGRAM DEPARTMENT AWARDS

All award submissions MUST include a narrative (either PDF or Microsoft Word) explaining why the Unit being nominated should receive the award. Supporting documentation is encouraged and may also be uploaded to give a full picture of the important mission work accomplished this year. If you include more than three supporting files, notify the email address listed in the form to be provided in a future bulletin. Supporting forms can be photos, newspaper clippings or PDF documents (no larger than 14MB)

POW/MIA Participation/event/proclamation – CERTIFICATE

GOLD STAR Effort, Event or proclamation – CERTIFICATE

MILITARYONESOURCE sign up to their website & use at least one suggestion – CERTIFICATE

SUPPORT ASYMCA by donating or volunteering or promoting – CERTIFICATE

BLUE STAR FAMILIES EVENT, EFFORTS or ACTIVITY - CERTIFICATE

QUILTS OF VALOR produced by unit member(s) or by working with a local community quilters guild/club – CERTIFICATE

*Each unit submitting narrative/details and entitled to a Department certificate will have one ticket placed in a drawing for each certificate. One Unit will be drawn from all the tickets for a \$45.00 cash award that is to be then used to support the unit National Security program.

BEST OVERALL DEPARTMENT NATIONAL SECURITY Unit Award - A plaque will be presented to the Unit chosen as the best overall Unit Report. Photos, News Clips, screen shots of unit facebook page or copies of proclamations must be included to qualify.

ALL unit entries MUST be submitted via electronic form by 10pm (Texas time) May 1, 2025.

ALL REPORTS MUST HAVE THE "AWARD NOMINATION FORM AND INFORMATION cover sheet included to qualify for forwarding to National or for Best Overall Unit.
