

#### 2023 INFORMATION AND REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

Location: Texas Lutheran University – Seguin, TX

Dates: Sunday, June 18, 2023 – Saturday, June 24, 2023

Fee: \$425.00 per delegate (does not include transportation to and from Girls State)

#### PURPOSE

The purpose of American Legion Auxiliary Texas Bluebonnet Girls State is to educate young women in the duties, privileges, rights, and responsibilities of American citizenship. We teach that a well-informed, intelligent, participating citizenry serves to protect and preserve our American institutions and democracy. Girls State is a mythical 51st State in which its citizens organize their own city, county, and state governments. The young citizens "learn by doing."

#### THE PROGRAM

Each day is carefully planned so that each student will have a part in the function of Girls State and the opportunity of learning for herself that her government is what she makes it. A visit to the State Capitol is included which offers an opportunity to assemble in the halls of our legislative bodies and meet state officials. The entire program is nonpartisan -- the "National" and "Federal" political parties organized during the session are purely mythical and for the sole purpose of enabling the students to set up their own city, county, and state governments, using the existing constitution and laws as guides.

#### ELIGIBILITY

- Eligibility is limited to any female student currently enrolled in the junior or third year of senior high school. ٠ All Texas high schools are eligible whether public or private.
- Students may not participate in more than one session of Girls State as citizens. •
- Participation in Girls State is not confined to daughters of members of the American Legion Auxiliary. •
- A student whose religion does not permit her to pledge allegiance to the U.S. flag is not eligible to attend. •
- ٠ Students must be able to participate in all scheduled activities.
- The Girls State Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any application for citizenship in Girls State. •
- To qualify for a certificate and pin, the student must attend the entire session. She may not leave the campus • except on scheduled trips of the entire group.
- All registration materials sent to a student and her parent/guardian by Girls State must be completed and ٠ submitted in a timely manner or the reservation will be cancelled without refund of fee.

#### **SELECTION OF STUDENTS**

- The basic qualifications for Girls State citizenship are leadership, citizenship, scholarship, and character. Selection should be based on these qualifications rather than on a single achievement such as excellence in scholarship or proficiency in athletics.
- Selection should be determined by nominations from the faculty of the school attended by the candidate and • approved by a school official. Please do not select a student and request the school to approve.

#### **SPONSORSHIP**

- The fee to reserve a spot may be funded by an ALA unit, school, or any interested community organization. •
- Under no circumstance shall a student or her parent/guardian/family pay the registration fee.
- The cost for the entire session is \$425.00 exclusive of transportation to and from Seguin. •
- An alternate delegate should be selected in the event the student who is chosen is unable to attend. •
- Each student, if invited, is expected to appear before her sponsoring group and describe her experiences at Girls • State after the session.
- Students should <u>not</u> be instructed to return from Girls State with "high honors" or election to a particular office. •

#### **REGISTRATION DATES**

- **February 1, 2023 May 1, 2023** Reservations open for ALA Units. Reservation Forms post-marked earlier than February 1st will not be accepted.
- February 15, 2023 May 1, 2023 Reservations open for schools to reserve spots directly.

#### **REGISTRATION RULES**

- No more than 6 students from any single school may be registered.
- A school may be sponsored by an ALA unit in an adjacent city or district if no unit within close proximity participates.
- A school may register for delegate spots directly without ALA sponsorship.
- An ALA unit may sponsor a home school student if she meets all eligibility requirements and qualifications.
- Reservations tend to fill up quickly. If reservations are full, you will be notified, and your reservation will be added to a waitlist. As spots become available, reservations will be moved from the waitlist in the order received.

#### **REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS/PROCESS**

- Mail Fee and completed "Reservation Form" to American Legion Auxiliary Dept Headquarters in Austin. Upon receipt, the Girls State Registrar will send to you "Delegate Information Forms" for the number of spots reserved. Please do not notify a student of her selection until you have received a "Delegate Information Form" as this form verifies that space is available for the student.
- Complete the "Delegate Information Form" for each student and return to the Girls State Registrar. Be sure all email addresses provided on the form are accurate and legible. This form <u>must</u> be signed by a School Official.
- Upon receipt of the "Delegate Information Form", Girls State will email the student and her parent/guardian directly with a link and instructions for completing the registration process on-line.
- With-in a few days of the student completing and submitting the on-line registration form, she will receive a "Girls State Citizen Instruction Packet" via email. These instructions will also be sent to the parent/guardian.
- The parent/guardian will receive an additional, separate email to electronically fill out and sign a health information form, a travel form, a media release, and a waiver of claims.
- Once all the above items have been completed, the student will be fully registered for the Girls State program.

#### CANCELLATIONS

- Contact the Girls State Registrar by phone or email to cancel a reserved spot or delegate. Cancellations must be followed up in writing. Any cancellation on or before May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 will receive a full refund.
- Cancellations after May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 will receive a two-thirds refund so long as the Girls State session opens with 500 delegates.
- No-shows are not eligible for a refund.

#### PREPARING YOUR DELEGATES FOR GIRLS STATE

- Provide delegates with your contact information in the event they have questions or need to cancel their participation.
- Work with your delegates to arrange for transportation to and from Seguin. Transportation must be provided by the unit, school, or parents. Girls State does not provide transportation, including transportation to or from area airports.
- Encourage delegates to visit the Girls State website (www.girls-state.org) for additional information including an overview of the program, the schedule of events and packing suggestions.
- Do not tell a delegate that she may leave the program early to attend another camp or that she may leave the program to attend another event and then return to Girls State as full-time participation is required.
- Contact the Girls State Registrar or a member of the ALA Girls State Committee with questions.
- Two citizens from the 2023 session of ALA Texas Girls State will be selected to attend ALA Girls Nation in Washington DC. To be eligible to attend, the delegate may be required to provide proof of citizenship or legal residency.

Protect our Camp Lejeune Veterans from Predatory Lawyers

After the passage of the Camp Lejeune Justice Act, veterans and family members who used contaminated water at Camp Lejeune can finally file lawsuits to recover damages for toxic exposure - but now unscrupulous lawyers are seeking to get rich off of them.

Attorneys are bound by U.S. code to charge "reasonable fees" when representing cases before the Board of Veterans' Appeals. Under the Federal Tort Claims Act, attorneys may also not charge a contingency fee in excess of 25 percent. While protections against excessive legal fees exist in other areas, none of the aforementioned statutes or regulations apply to those seeking a cause of action under the CLJA.

Consequently, predatory law firms have blanketed the airwaves of television, radio, and social media with marketing campaigns targeting veterans through sponsored content. With no federal limits on contingencies, lawyers can charge fees upwards of 60% to sick veterans. We cannot allow this exploitation to persist.

In response to this, The American Legion National Executive Committee passed <u>Resolution No. 15</u>: *Oversight of Camp Lejeune Justice Act* at its Fall meeting, urging Congressional oversight to ensure veterans' protections against predatory law firms. This means setting reasonable caps on attorney fees, and we ask that you write your Senators today to demand they pass legislation instituting them!



### Salute to Servicemember Award

Established in 2003, this award has evolved from honoring women veterans and to honoring all enlisted personnel who are currently serving our country in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corp and Coast Guard (includes National Guard and Reserve components of each branch).

One enlisted servicemember from each branch of service will be recognized at the American Legion Auxiliary Department Convention in Austin, Texas in July 2023. Each one will then be forwarded to the American Legion Auxiliary National organization to compete where one servicemember from each branch as well as the National Guard/Reserve will be recognized at the American Legion Auxiliary National Convention. Recipients of the honor will attend the National Convention as guests of the Auxiliary.

#### Nomination Criteria:

- A servicemember currently serving in the U.S. Armed Forces with six months or more of federal service and National Guard/Reserve with less than six months of federal service and willing to attend the 2023 Nation Convention.
- A servicemember who demonstrates a track record of exemplary service, both in and out of uniform.
- Entry must be either a written narrative of 750 words or less or a YouTube video of 3 minutes or less that shows the nominated member demonstrating exemplary service both in and out of uniform.
- If you choose a You Tube video, it can take the place of a written narrative (see video checklist below).
- Entry must have nominees name and address, Unit name and number and signature of Unit President or Past Presidents Parley Chairman.
- One applicant for each branch of service per Unit may be entered. All entries must be received no later than May 1, 2023. Send entries to Texas Past Presidents Parley Chairman: MaryAnn Paul, 9916 Nixon Dr., McKinney, TX 75072 or emailed to mapminmol@gmail.com.
- If chosen as a Department honoree, and if she desires to be recognized and to address the American Legion Auxiliary assembly at the state convention in Austin, Texas, the servicewoman would do so at her own expense (or that of the Unit).

Please reach out to me as the Department of Texas does have some poppies that we can sell. Also, be thinking about how you can decorate your poppy table/display. Think creatively! Draw people to you! Friendly reminder to use the Poppy Guidelines that can be found on the National website. This tells you what you can use Poppy funds for and what you can't.

Believe me, you do not want to wait until the last minute to get all of this information from your Unit members. Make sure you are bragging about yourself and all of your Unit members! We want to know what you have been up to and what great things you did this year!

#### **Poppy Poster Contest Rules**

Units shall sponsor contests in local schools. When schools do not conduct activities, other youth groups, including Junior members, may participate under direct supervision of the unit.

#### **Contest Classes**

- Class I: Grades 2 and 3
- Class II: Grades 4 and 5
- Class III: Grades 6 and 7
- Class IV: Grades 8 and 9
- Class V: Grades 10 and 11
- Class VI: Grade 12
- Class VII: Students with special needs defined as:
  - a. Those in special education classes
  - b. A student recommended for special education classes but who has not been admitted due to a waiting list or various other factors.
  - c. A child identified as having a disability, but not in a special education class due to lack of facilities; identification contingent upon discretion of school officials.

#### **Poppy Poster Requirements**

- 1. Each poster shall have a fitting slogan not to exceed 10 words. Articles "a", "and," "an", "the" are not to be counted as words. The words "buddy" and "buy" cannot be used.
- 2. The words "American Legion Auxiliary" must be used in the design of the poster and will not be counted in the 10-word count.
- 3. Each poster must include a picture of the red Flanders Field poppy.
- 4. The department shall determine the closing date of the unit contest. The poster shall be on 11x14" poster board. (Drawing paper will not be accepted).
- 5. The United States flag may be used as long as there are no infractions of the flag code.
- 6. Posters will be judged using the following criteria:
  - 50% poster appeal (layout, message, originality)
  - 40% artistic ability (design and color)
  - 10% neatness
- 7. Media used shall be watercolors, crayons, powder or oil paint, handmade paper cutouts, ink or textures, acrylics, pencils and markers.
- 8. Written in ink on the back of the poster (not attached) shall be the class in which the entry is submitted, the name, address, age and grade of the contestant and the name of the department.
- 9. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians' grant non-exclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.

10. The poster shall be the work of only one individual.

11. The label "In Memoriam" from the veteran-made poppy may not be used.

#### **Poppy Poster Contest Judging and Awards**

1. Each department shall establish its own procedure for judging.

2. A citation will be given for the most outstanding poster in each classification within the five divisions.

3. Unit members should follow deadlines and process for the department. All department entries are due to the division chairman by June 1.

4. While ALA representatives will do their best to return all posters, it is not guaranteed. We recommend participants take a picture or scan their poster for their records.

5. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant nonexclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted, and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.







## TIPS FOR CREATING YOUR NEWSLETTER

Your Unit/District/Department's Newsletter can be one of your greatest advertising tools. Here are some helpful tips for creating your newsletter

#### What goes into your newsletter? •

- The message you want your members to receive should be your main focus, listed first and up front always keeping the ALA mission first and foremost.
- Have a monthly calendar, include meetings, events, and volunteer opportunities. This will give members the opportunity to participate in events.
- In the monthly newsletters, share what Unit/District/Department has done in the previous month. Include pictures, news releases.
- Maintain your members' engagement with a newsletter of 2 to 3 pages.
- If you have the space, include educational pieces, such as the meaning behind the poppy.
- Have a fun area which can have members' birthdays and anniversaries.

#### Distribution: What works for your Unit/District/Department?

Email or USPS mail, what is the most cost-effective method to get your newsletter out to your members?

- Email is great, but will it reach all members?
- U.S. Postal Service offers bulk mailing rate. It may be a viable option.
