# Facebook – Page or Group?

An online presence is a great way to publicize your unit's activities. Facebook is one possible online platform. If you want to have one spot to share posts from your unit to advertise upcoming events, share photos and updates about recent events, or just post reminders of patriotic dates (Flag Day, etc.), create a Facebook business page. If you want a place where people can connect and have discussions, create a Facebook group.

Business pages are similar to personal profiles but focus on your unit as a public entity instead of an individual. Once your page is set, you post updates like how you would post updates to your personal profile. Also like your personal profile, people may comment on your updates. Instead of being your "friends," people follow your page by "liking" your page. Once they've liked your page, your posts will show up on their Facebook news feeds

Facebook groups are entirely different. While business pages are essentially profile pages maintained and updated by the administrators, Facebook groups are maintained by the community. The group's admins can set it up to have open-to-the-public membership, membership upon approval, or membership by invitation only. Once someone becomes a member of that Facebook group, they can start posting to that community. Posts will show up in members' news feeds. Members can share resources, events, ideas, and questions with each other (which will only be visible to other members of that Facebook group).

Which to Choose, Facebook Page or Group?

So, which one should you choose? It all depends on your goals and objectives. If you're looking to promote your unit, increase awareness of your mission, and grow membership, then a Facebook Business Page is the way to go. If you're looking to build a community of like-minded people and share ideas and information, then a Facebook Group is the way to go.

However, ALA National Headquarters recommends that every unit has a Facebook business page. So, if you are interested in a group page, you may want to have both.
