

THE AMERICAN LEGION FAMILY



The American Legion – A Veteran who has served at least one day of active military duty since December 7, 1941 and was honorably discharged or is still serving active military duty honorably.

The American Legion Auxiliary – Membership includes grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of members of The American Legion; and grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of all veterans and active military who served in either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918 and any time after December 7, 1941; those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion.

Sons of the Legion (SAL) - SAL members include males of all ages whose parents or grandparents served in the U.S. military and were eligible for American Legion membership.

American Legion Riders (ALR) -To become a member, you must be a current member in good standing of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of the American Legion, be the owner of a motorcycle of at least 350cc engine and possess a valid driver's license in your state of residence ~or~ you must be a current member in good standing of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of the American Legion and must be the legal spouse of an ALR member in good standing within the Chapter of application.
